

## Energy Office Review of Duke Energy Progress 2018 Integrated Resource Plan

The ORS Energy Office (Energy Office) pursuant to SC Code Section 58-37-40(C) provides the following evaluation of the Duke Energy Progress (DEP) 2018 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP).

SC Code Section 58-37-40(C) states, "The State Energy Office, to the extent practicable, shall evaluate and comment on external environmental and economic consequences of each integrated resource plan submitted and on the environmental and economic consequences for suppliers and distributors."

Through the Energy Office's development of the State Energy Plan, a study committee was established to evaluate South Carolina's IRP process. This committee consisted of diverse representation to include state agencies, conservationists, special interest groups, electric utilities, and electric cooperatives. The committee met frequently to develop IRP <u>Guidelines</u>. On December 15, 2017, the IRP study committee adopted the IRP Guidelines by consensus. These guidelines include best practices to be considered when electric utilities develop annual IRPs. The Energy Office's review of IRPs is based on these guidelines.

On November 1, 2018, DEP filed its 2018 IRP with the Energy Office. On February 20, 2019, the Energy Office requested additional information from DEP relating to its IRP submittal. DEP submitted responses on March 6, 2019. One question referred to the best practices included in the IRP Guidelines.

The Energy Office requested of DEP "With reference to the consensus IRP Best Practices Guidelines produced by the State Energy Plan IRP Study Committee, please discuss how DEP has addressed each best practice listed below in its 2018 IRP."

DEP responded to each IRP Best Practice and noted where it is discussed in the IRP. Where information was not provided in the IRP, DEP indicated plans to include the information in the future. Additional data needed to comply with the Best Practices was also provided.

During the study committee discussions, the electric utilities agreed to evaluate their current IRP process and incorporate the IRP Guidelines as appropriate. The Energy Office encourages DEP to continue to incorporate the IRP Guidelines into future IRPs, as appropriate, including opportunities for stakeholder input and public engagement.

Additionally, the Energy Office encourages DEP to:

- 1. Highlight South Carolina specific information where feasible throughout the IRP and limit references to North Carolina information that does not pertain to South Carolina programs.
- 2. Consider evaluating the benefit of using retired combustion turbine/diesel units in emergency situations such as backup power at Medical Needs Shelters.
