City of Orangeburg Department of Public Utilities

Integrated Resource Plan

The *City of Orangeburg Department of Public Utilities* owns and operates an electric distribution utility (the Utility). South Carolina Code Ann. Section 58-37-40 requires a municipal electric utility to prepare an Integrated Resource Plan, submit the plan to the State Energy Office, and post the plan to the Utility's website.

The Utility purchases bulk power from *Dominion Energy of South Carolina*, the Power Supplier, through an all requirements wholesale power purchase agreement (the Agreement). The current contract period runs from <u>January 2012</u> to <u>December 2023</u>. The Agreement requires the Power Supplier to furnish and the Utility to purchase and receive all power required to serve the utility's customers except for de-minimis demand-side peak-shaving generation and the power supplied from the source(s) and at the capacity listed below:

Other wholesale power supply agreements include:

SEPA allocation capacity <u>15,090</u> kW

Under the Agreement, the Power Supplier is solely responsible for the operation, maintenance, replacement of generation facilities, securing other supplies if necessary, and the dispatch and transmission of power delivered to meet the requirements of the Agreement. The power supplied to the Utility reflects the generation portfolio of the supplier(s). During the contract period, the power supplier(s) retain the right to determine the generating facility(s), and source(s) of power delivered to meet the obligations of the Agreement.
